

PLEASE HELP DR. ANH REISS (NGUYEN)

Dr. Anh Reiss (Nguyen), an OB/GYN located in Southwest Houston, just learned in February 2009 that she has a fatal bone marrow disease and needs a stem cell transplant very soon. She may only have a few months to live. Unfortunately, none of her family members were a match, and being Vietnamese makes her potential donor pool very small since so few in the Vietnamese community participate in such donor programs. Only about 5% of the stem cell/bone marrow pool consists of minorities; 95% are Caucasian donors.
