# Asian American Election Protection and Poll Monitoring Defending Asian American Voting Rights

General Elections -- Tuesday, November 6, 2012

In past elections, Asian Americans have faced a series of barriers in exercising their right to vote. For example, poll workers were hostile and made racist remarks, poll sites had too few interpreters to assist Asian American voters, translated voting materials were missing or hidden from voters, and ballots were mistranslated listing Democratic candidates as Republicans, and vice versa. Then, when the news media reported on election returns and the vote by specific groups, Asian Americans were often overlooked.

In response, the Asian American Legal Defense and Education Fund has conducted a non-partisan survey of Asian American voters to document Asian American voting patterns. AALDEF has also monitored the elections for compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act, which mandates bilingual ballots and forbids anti-Asian voter discrimination.

On November 6, 2012, AALDEF along with several other Asian American groups will be monitoring the elections and conducting non-partisan voter surveys at polling sites in Asian American neighborhoods in at least ten states. **We need your help.** 

In the 2008 elections, 1,500 volunteers polled almost 17,000 Asian American voters in eleven states and Washington, DC. Volunteers are needed to administer a multilingual voter survey in 3-hour shifts and document voting problems on Election Day. Polls are generally open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

There will be a one and a half hour training session for all volunteers. All volunteers must be non-partisan during the time that they help. To sign up, complete the registration form on the next page. Thank you!



### 2012 Law Student Diversity Scholarship

The Association of Corporate Counsel Houston Chapter (ACC) announces its annual Law Student Diversity Scholarship Program open to incoming second and third year minority law students at the three Houston-area law schools. Up to twelve \$4,000 Scholarships will be awarded for the 2012-2013 school year.

The goal is to give the grants to students who meet the following criteria in order of importance:

- (1) Enrollment at a Houston-area law school in the Fall 2012 semester;
- (2) Academic accomplishment (i.e., official transcript reflecting student's calculated GPA and overall ranking in top third of his or her class);
- (3) Diverse status as a racial or ethnic minority;
- (4) Extra-curricular activities (e.g., pro bono); and
- (5) Service to the law school

Students interested in applying for the scholarship should visit their school's student or career services office for more information and application form. Each school's designated representative will collect application packets on behalf of ACC.

The deadline for submission of the application packet to each school's designated representative is <u>WEDNESDAY</u>, OCTOBER 24, 2012.
